A. — a graduate of West Point, and who was in command of Fortress Monroe during the late Civil War. He died at Bennington, Vt., on the 8th of June, 1843. His first wife died at Fultonville, N. Y., on the 23d of May, 1844. His second wife, who was born December 20, 1797, died on the 29th of March, 1851, at Palmyra, N. Y., at the residence of her son in-law, Rev. Daniel Harrington.
