

had been granted to his father, Job Alvord, by U. S. for services as Capt. in the Revolution.

In 1848 Sylvester Judd secured facts about the fish industry in early times along the Conn. River, from Justin Alvord then in his 85th year. Alvord claimed that catches of thirty-three hundred shad were made in one day. Sometimes salmon were found in the nets. Alvord sold thousands of shad after the Revolution for three copers each. Mrs. Lois Alvord was a remarkable woman .

According to U. S. Census of 1790 Selah Alvord and wife were living at Brookfield, Vt. In 1800 the census found them at Norwich, Vt., with a son, a daughter, both under ten years. The family is said to have removed to Indiana.
