Hezekiah Eastman was of Granby, Mass., in 1793, when he signed a receipt in the settlement of his father's estate. He indentured his sons to his brother Benjamin Oct. 18, 1810, and they were bound to serve until they were fourteen years of age.

Mrs. Theodocia (Alvord) Eastman lived with her son Benjamin until his death, when she went to live with her sisters, Mrs. Rhoda Hubbard and Mrs. Amanda Hooker in Springfield, Mass.

Gaius Alvord in his younger days was an unusually active and enterprising farmer of Granby, Mass. He was thrown from his carriage and injured his head which caused him at times to be deranged. Sometimes he would be very active and then occasionally despondent and idle. He sold his farm in Granby, Mass., and purchased a farm in Orange, N. J., where he removed in May, 1825. He was a noble looking man, an affectionate father, a kind and tender husband.
