George Scriba Alvord for many years superintended Fitzhugh and Littlejohn's Lake and Canal business at Oswego, N. Y., and on Oneida Lake, at the time when they began to run a line of boats on that water. He was later employed as the agent of the Midland Ry. Co. Mr. Alvord always took a prominent part in city affairs, representing the 2nd Ward as alderman in 1849. He was in the Common Council from 1853-4, 1858-62. He was a man of original ideas and firm opinions, and of great integrity.
