FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE ALVORD (*Nelson, Joel, Bela, Aaron, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born near Vermillionville, Ill., June 21, 1857; married Seneca, Kan., Oct. 30, 1878, Milo Andrews Hamilton, son of Hugh and Rachel (McCune) Hamilton.
