

1890. MARY LOUISA ALVORD (*Christopher Columbus, Gaius, Gad, Gad, John, Thomas, Alexander*), born Orange, N. J., June 23, 1837; married Philadelphia, Pa., Oct. 13, 1863, Edward Cornelius Ewing, son of George Clinton and Lydia Anne (Stillwell) Ewing. He was born Walpole, N. H., Dec. 20, 1837. Res. Ashfield, Mass., Enfield, Mass., Danvers, Mass., Roxbury, Mass., and New Castle, N. H., 1907. Children:

- a. George Henry, b. Enfield, Mass., Feb. 21, 1868; now pastor of Cong. Church at Norwich Town, Conn., 1906; mar. Danvers, Mass., Sept. 2, 1893, Sarah Holt Porter. They have children: Helen Porter, b. Feb. 28, 1895; Edward Raymond, b. Mar. 18, 1897; Margaret Alvord, b. June 25, 1900. All born in China. Mr. Ewing graduated at Amherst College in 1890; Yale Theological School in 1893 and went as missionary to North China in Sept., 1893. With his family he left Paotingfu two weeks before the Boxer uprising took form there. Those who remained were massacred.
- b. Charles Edward, b. Enfield, Mass., May 24, 1869; a missionary at Tientsin, China, 1906; mar. New Haven, Ct., July 12, 1894, Bessie Goodyear Smith. They have children: Marion, b. May 15, 1895; Ellen, b. Oct. 10, 1898; Edward Alvord, b. Dec. 26, 1900. Mr. Ewing graduated at Amherst College in 1890 and the Yale Theological School in 1893. He then went as missionary to China and with his family was shut up in Peking during the siege. He was a member of the "fortification committee" and had oversight of the natives while at work on the fortifications.
- c. Addison Alvord, b. Enfield, Mass., Aug. 25, 1871; res. Madison, Wis., 1906; mar. Danvers, Mass., Sept. 1, 1896, Elizabeth Abbott Learoyd. He graduated at Amherst College in 1892 and took a post-graduate course in philosophy for one year, after which he took a course of study in theology and psychology at Chicago University. He taught for three years at Wabash College and then entered the ministry in the Episcopal Church, and is now rector of Grace Church, Madison, Wis.
- d. William Clinton, b. Enfield, Mass., Feb. 18, 1875; mar. Roxbury, Mass., June 21, 1899, Florence Anna Wood. He graduated at the Boston Institute of Technology in 1897; now surveyor in Roxbury, Mass.

Edward C. Ewing is a clergyman. He graduated at Amherst College in 1859, afterwards studying theology at Bangor and Princeton Theological Sems., graduating from both. He has preached at Ashfield, Enfield, Danvers, and Roxbury, Mass.
