STATE CAPITAL, DENVER.

COLORADO is bounded north by Nebraska and Wyoming Territory, east by Nebraska and Kansas, south by the Indian Territory and New Mexico, and west by Utah. Average length from east to west 380 miles, breadth, 280 miles; land area, 103,645 square miles. The surface consists of three divisions—the mountains and parks, the foot-hills, and the plains. It is intersected near the center by the Sierra Madre Range of the Rocky Mountains, including the highest peaks, among which are Pike's and Long's Peaks, Mts. Torrey, Lincoln, Gray, Yale, Harvard, the Spanish Peaks, etc. The mountains enclose the wonderful valleys or basins known as parks, many of which are small, but others larger than some entire States. These parks are well timbered, and abound with beautiful scenery, being diversified with low hills and ridges, which contain the sources of all the great rivers that rise in the State. The eastern part of Colorado is an immense plain, well adapted to stock raising. Agriculture is being carried on to a greater extent than ever before. Extensive irrigating ditches have been constructed and are being rapidly added to, both in the river valleys of the west, and along the Arkansas in the east. The total length of canals at the present time is about 4,000 miles; acres irrigated, over 2,000,000. Where water can be had the soil is very productive. The leading farm products are wheat, corn, barley, oats, hay, potatoes, fruits, garden and dairy products. The yield of wheat is over 2,500,000 bushels, of oats 1,500,000, of corn, over 1,000,000, and of potatoes about 3,000,000. Cattle raising and sheep farming are the chief agricultural pursuits. It is estimated to have 2,000,000 sheep, and 1,500,000 cattle, while the wool clip is about 10,000,000 pounds. Lumbering is an important industry, but the mining of gold, silver, and other metals is the chief source of wealth. Large beds of lignite, of good quality, exist, the total extent of coal bearing strata in the state being estimated at more than 26,000,000 acres, or as large as all England. Upward of 2,000,000 tons of coal are produced annually. Petroleum has been discovered, and thirty wells have been opened near Florence. Copper, cement, fire clay, and manganese are worked to some extent, while the iron of the state is manufactured into steel and iron rails. There are 56 Counties in Colorado; newspapers are published in all.
