186. **ANNIE LAURIE SAMMONS,**<sup>6</sup> Roscoe and Rockford High Schools. An earnest and active Christian, abstaining from worldly amusements and other vanities. May 4, 1893, died of heart failure.

164. **HENRY ALFRED RHODES,**<sup>3</sup> John J.<sup>1</sup> G. A. R., Republican. Enlisted at Roscoe, Ill., February, 1865, in Company A, 153rd Regiment, Illinois. Residence, Manhattan Hotel, Wichita, Kansas.

16. **ANNE RHODES,**<sup>4</sup> John,<sup>3</sup> William,<sup>2</sup> Thomas,<sup>1</sup> married Hezekiah Shepard, February 4, 1830. Died from consumption, January, 1839, leaving an infant son. She was rarely beautiful in person and character, loved and admired by all.

Then a successful manufacturer of gloves, mittens, etc., Gloversville, N. Y. In 1877 entered the firm of L. Sweet & Co., Wellsville, N. Y., manufacturers of the Royce reapers and mowers. Taken sick while on a business trip in Virginia, he returned home to Canandaigua, where he died of typhoid fever, October 28, 1878. A man of good morals and habits. mirthful, generous, handsome in person, greatly beloved. Celestia married second John Van Arsdale, of Canandaigua, August 27, 1882.
