MEMORANDA.

Professor Peter N. Hagle, M. D., was a graduate of the Medical School at Ann Arbor, Mich. After practising medicine for a short time after graduating he turned his attention to teaching—in which he was very successful. He was also an ardent worker in the cause of temperance, so much so, that he ran for Lieutenant-Governor on the Prohibition ticket of the State of Michigan in 1888. He polled a large vote, but failed of an election. Though a strong man physically—having, in fact, won several prizes in running races and base ball playing—he yet fell a victim to quick consumption and died suddenly in August, 1890.
