264. PHINEAS ALVORD (*Phineas, Thomas, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Middletown, Conn., Aug. 7, 1763; died Rochester, Vt., May 14, 1836; married 2nd prob. Rochester, Vt., about 1812, Mrs. Nancy Ann (Wood) Martin, daughter of a sea-captain, a native of Conn. She was born in Cuba, 1769; died Rochester, Vt., Oct. 8, 1852. Res. Rochester, Windsor Co., Vt. Children:

639. Zelotes, b. in Vermont, Nov. 17, 1790.

640. Philemon, b. perhaps Vergennes, Vt., about 1798.

641. Phineas, b. prob. Vergennes, Vt., about 1800.

(Probably there were other children.)

"Daniel Alvord was elected guardian to Phineas Alvord (minor), son of Phineas, late of Middletown, deceased, Nov. 2, 1778." (Mid. Prob. Rec.)

It is a tradition that at one time Phineas Alvord lived with his cousin John, son of John. In 1830 he sold property in Rochester, Vt. to Thos. B. Martin with whom he made his home. His children were by a former wife. He is remembered by his step-grandchild as a fine old gentleman.

U. S. Census of 1790 states that Phineas "Alhurd" was a resident of New Haven, Vt. In the family were 2 males over 16, 2 males under 16 and 1 female. U. S. Census 1800, he was at Vergennes, Vt., 1 male under 10 yrs., 1 male 26-45, 2 females under 10, 1 female 26-45. In 1820 he was of Rochester, Vt. He was buried at Rochester, Vt.

Rev. War Service: (Not given by "Conn. Men in the Rev.") From his application for pension, July 18, 1832. His claim was allowed. Enlisted as private, Apr., 1781 in a small squad of horse, Flying Camp, Gen. Waterbury's suite from Conn. Enlisted in Apr., 1782, private in Capt. Miel's Co., Col. Canfield's Reg. of Conn. Discharged about the end of war. He sustained a bayonet wound of breast in engagement with "cowboys" in which he was captured and confined in "Old Sugar House," New York City, for four months. Pension, \$80 a year.
