Orren H. Lee was a drum major in the War of 1812 at the age of fifteen. He was stationed at New London, Conn. He served eight terms in the Conn. Legislature.

Mrs. Elizabeth (Alvord) Gates joined the church at East Hampton, Conn., by letter from New London, Nov. 7, 1819, and was dismissed to Granby, Conn., in 1853.

Chauncey Hart Alvord learned the clothier's trade of his brother, Otis, at Middlefield, Conn., when he was sixteen years old. After Otis removed to N. Y. State Chauncey went to Torrington, Conn., and worked for some time; from there he went to Goshen, Conn., and worked until his health failed. Seeking out-of-door employment he took a dairy farm, and as his health improved he bought a farm in Litchfield Co., South Farms, town of Morris, Conn., where he lived until his death. He represented his town in the Conn. State Legislature at Hartford in 1867, and frequently held town offices.
