770. SARAH ALVORD (*Otis, Seth, Seth, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Middletown, Conn., Sept. 29, 1819; died Elmira, N. Y., Aug. 20, 1890; married Catlin, N. Y., Jan. 30, 1839, Ransom Pratt, son of Daniel and Mary (Pratt) Pratt. He was born Colchester, Conn., May 8, 1808; died Elmira, N. Y., Aug. 20, 1871. Res. Elmira, N. Y. Children:

He read law in office of Hon. G. L. Smith and Hon. David B. Hill of Elmira. He was admitted to the bar in 1872 and afterwards practiced his profession at Elmira. In 1892, he was Asst. Prof. in the Cornell Law School for a brief period. In 1894 was a member of the Constitutional Convention. Jan. 1, 1897, he became county judge and surrogate of Chemung Co., N. Y., elected for a term of six years.

Ransom Pratt was for nearly thirty years a leading business man of Elmira, N. Y. During that time he was instrumental in much
