He was present at the first battle of Bull Run, after which he returned home sick, and in the fall of 1862 he enlisted in the 141st N. Y. Vols. He was in Gen. Sherman's "March to the Sea," and received his discharge in the summer of 1865. In 1868 he married for his second wife Emily C. Claghorn, and has lived at St. Louis, Mo., Elmira, N. Y., and Moreland, N. Y., where he still resides (1906.) Mr. Bailey is a member of the Cong. Church, stands by the Bible and N. Y. Tribune; is a member of no secret society, and carries no insurance. At the age of eighty-one he enjoys good health.

773. ANNE ALVORD (*Chauncey Hart, Seth, Seth, Thomas, Thomas, Alexander*), born Goshen, Conn., May 23, 1828; married East Hampton, Conn., Nov. 19, 1846, Noah Sparrow Markham, son of Nathaniel and Nabbe Judd (Smith) Markham. He was born Chatham, Conn., Aug. 14, 1816; died Willimantic, Conn., Aug. 2, 1892. Res. East Hampton, Conn. (1846-1858), Glastonbury, Conn. (1858-1873), and Willimantic, Conn. Children:

- a. Nathaniel Augustus, b. East Hampton, Conn., Sept. 16, 1847; d. Thomasville, Ga., Dec. 27, 1880; mar. Sept. 16, 1872, Mary Wood, who now resides at San Francisco, Cal. They had one child: Herbert Stanley, who died when at school. Mr. N. A. Markham was educated at Westfield and Wilbraham, Mass. He was book-keeper in the office of the Meriden Britannia Co. for two years. From there he went to Winsted, Conn., and was employed as shipping clerk in the Cabinet, Hardware and Coffin Trimming Factory. His health failing, he went to Ga., where he died.
- b. Arthur Leon, b. East Hampton, Conn., Apr. 18, 1855; died East Hampton, Conn., Aug. 14, 1873.

Noah S. Markham was a scythe maker by trade, and manufactured scythes and hoes on the site now occupied by the D. W. Watrous Co. at East Hampton, Conn. His goods were among the best, but improved methods and competition destroyed his business, which he relinquished for one requiring less capital. He was postmaster at East Hampton, Conn., for several years.

Mrs. Anne (Alvord) Markham was educated at Waterford, Conn., and at the Bacon Academy, Colchester, Conn. When a girl she lived with her aunt, Elizabeth (Alvord) Gates. She is now living (1908) at Willimantic, Conn., and has been most helpful in this work.
