Jerome Lobdell Alvord was deputy sheriff of Middlesex Co., Conn., and in the employ of White and Veary, manufacturers of bells. He was a member of the First Church of East Hampton, Conn., and belonged to the Masonic Order.

Mr. Alvord was of a remarkably cheerful disposition and of great sympathy for the afflictions of others. He was held in high esteem in the community. His death was the result of an injury.
