JUSTIN MERRICK ALVORD (*Justin, Justin, Job, John, Thomas, Alexander*), born Pittsfield, Mass., Nov. 9, 1830; married 1st, Oconomowoc, Wis., Dec. 28, 1856, Anna Elmino Dibble, daughter of Jasper and Harriet (Higgins) Dibble. She was born Alexandria, Jefferson Co., N. Y., Nov. 13, 1835; died Oconomowoc, Wis., Apr. 11, 1875. He married 2nd, Oconomowoc, Wis., Nov. 20, 1880, Lizzie Harriet Jones, daughter of Henry and Emeline (Smallwood) Jones. She was born Concord, Wis., July 6, 1858. Res. Oconomowoc, Wis., 1908. When Justin Merrick Alvord was seven years old his parents moved from Pittsfield, Mass., to Attica, Wyoming Co., N. Y., where he remained until he was eighteen years of age, when he went to Milwaukee, Wis. After remaining there a year, in the fall of 1849 he located at Oconomowoc, Wis., and worked at his trade as a mason. He was a soldier in the Civil War, being mustered into the service at Milwaukee, Aug. 2, 1862, in Co. C, 28th Reg., Wis. Vol. Inf., Thomas H. Stevens, Capt. His Reg. was assigned to the 2nd Brigade. Mr. Alvord was corporal when he left the state, but at Columbus, Ky., he was detailed to the Commissary Dept., where he remained until the regiment arrived at Helena, Ark. Here he received orders to report to the P. O. After the fall of Vicksburg he rejoined his regiment and went to Little Rock, Ark., and took charge of the Ry. Commissary until his regiment went to New
