1185. EMILY LOUISE ALVORD (*Benjamin, William, Elisha, Joseph, Ebenezer, Alexander*), born Fort Vancouver, Wash., Oct. 20, 1858; married Washington, D. C., May 4, 1880, Thomas Craig, son of Alexander and Mary (Hall) Craig. He was born Pittston, Pa., Dec. 20, 1855; died Baltimore, Md., May 8, 1900. Res. Baltimore, Md. (1906). Children:

Thomas Craig was of Scotch parentage. He graduated at Lafayette College and afterwards went to Johns Hopkins where he was first Fellow in Mathematics. In June, 1878, the degree of Ph.D. was conferred upon him and during the two years following he was connected with the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey, returning to Johns Hopkins in 1881 as Asst. Prof. of Mathematics. Mr. Craig was afterwards made full professor and head of the Mathematical Department which he held until his death. He was editor of the American Journal of Math. and author of several books on mathematics and many papers published at home and abroad. He was a member of the London Math. Soc., also of the French Soc.
