FRANKLIN CLARK ALVORD (*Nelson, Jehiel, Jehiel, Jonathan, Jonathan, Alexander*), born Easthampton, Mass., Dec. 21, 1836; died Northampton, Mass., Mar. 25, 1904; married Northampton, Mass., Oct. 2, 1871, Ellen Ryan, daughter of John and Mary (Walch) Ryan. She was born Portshluckberry, Nova Scotia, Feb. 3, 1850. Res. Northampton, Mass. No children.

Franklin Clark Alvord enlisted as a soldier in the Civil War in 1861, Co. A, 27th Mass. Reg. He was in many battles, but went through the entire war without a wound. He was in Andersonville Prison seven months. When released he weighed only sixty pounds. At times he was four days without food and then had only dried beans or corn. His life was despaired of for many months after his release. His widow lives (1904) at Fall River, Mass.
