David Davies was prominently connected with the starch manufactory of T. Kingsford and Sons for many years and was much esteemed for his faithfulness and business habits.

He was appointed American Vice Consul to Minister Bellamy Storer in Spain, which position he held for about three years. At the present time he is Consul of the U. S. at Ceiba, Honduras.

Jay D. Wood was a great grandson of Asa Danforth, the first white settler in Onondaga Co., N. Y. After receiving a thorough education, he went to Buffalo and entered the employ of a large steamboat company operating a fleet of steamers on the Great Lakes. He was soon made purchasing agent for the company. Later he held a position with a large express company in the West. He returned to Oswego and entered the employ of Kingsfords where he remained for more than forty years in charge of the manufacture of starch boxes. After retiring from this position he was elected sealer of weights and measures.
