JACOB ALVORD, of Lykens, Pa., born in Dauphin Co., Pa., Mar. 21, 1837, writes that his father's name was George Alvord, his mother was a Shumber. His father's family certainly lived in Lebanon and Lancaster counties, Pa., and some of them perhaps in Berks County. He says that there were some of the family living in Lancaster and Lebanon Counties, who claimed they were cousins, but spelled their name *Albert*. George Alvord was born in 1794, and died in 1866. His, George's, father died when he was a child, and his mother married Conrad Updegrave. The children of George Alvord were: Frederick, Henry H., David, Jacob, George W., William H., Nancy, Catherine, Elizabeth and Ebalena. Jacob Alvord married Mar. 8, 1864, Lucy A. Hoffman, and has children; Florence, b. 1867, Lotta, b. 1871, Minnie E., b. 1873, Lucy P., b. 1877, and J. M. Alvord of Dayton, O. Five of the sons of George Alvord were in the Civil War. Only Jacob and William H., were living in 1905. The latter who lives at Cortland, Neb., writes that some of his father's brothers lived near Hagerstown, Pa., (It is probable that the above branch are of Dutch ancestry and that the early spelling was Albert and not Alvord, hence not descendants of Alexander Alvord).

ISOLATED OCCURRENCES OF THE NAME.

WILLIAM ALVERD, Stokes Co., N. C., 1790, head of a family. (U. S. Census)—prob. an Alford.

HENRY ALVORD, Sharon, Vt., 1800, head of a family. (U. S. Census).

JASON ALVORD, died Hanover, Mass., Aug. 31, 1797, aged 63. (R. I. Vital Rec.).

ELIJAH ALVORD, adult, bapt., June 10, 1801. Lydia, daughter of Mr. Alvord, bapt. same day. Eliza Alvord, an early member of St. Luke's Church, Lanesboro, Mass. (St. Luke's Ch. Rec., Lanesboro, Mass.)

SETH ALVORD, enlisted as a private in the 1st. U. S. Infantry, commanded by Col. Thomas Hunt, Apr. 11, 1805, to serve to Apr. 11, 1810. His name last appears on a roll of Capt. D. Bissell's Co., said Regiment, dated at Ft. Massac, Mar. 31, 1808, which shows him "absent on command at Vincennes, since Oct. 10, 1806. (Adj. Gen's. Office Wash., D. C.).

PHEBE ALVORD, married Jonathan Tisdale, of Homer, N. Y., "many years ago" and moved to New York City, or vicinity.
