

## MISCELLANEOUS.

JOHN, son of Samuel, son of Thomas Barber 1st, and his brother Samuel were among the first proprietors of the town of Harwinton, in 1732. Samuel, however, did not settle there until 1733, and about the same time two of the sons of Josiah, Simeon and Timothy, who, with Reuben and Benjamin, sons of John, represented the family of Barber in that town when the County of Litchfield was established in 1751. Reuben, Benjamin, Simeon and Timothy all entered the Continental Army as from Harwinton.

The following of their descendants represented the town in the State Legislature: Ashabel, great grandson of John, in 1842-3; Charles Hubert and Cyrus L., respectively, in 1874 and 1875.

We have referred to the town of Suffield, and to the fact that it was settled by John, son of Thomas 1st, and his descendants, some of whom removed to Westfield, Mass., and thence to Pittsfield, Mass.

JOSEPH, son of Joseph, son of Samuel, son of Thomas, and Josiah and Nathaniel, sons of Nathaniel, son of Josiah, son of Thomas 1st, became proprietors of the town of Torrington.

In 1732, the taxable inhabitants of Windsor were divided into seven companies or corporations, each taking their name after the town. Samuel, John and Josiah belonged to that of the Mathew Allen, Roger
