

THE GENEALOGY.

DANIEL THURSTON,¹ "the kinsman," and probable ancestor of all the Newbury Thurstons, m. Oct. 20, 1655, ANNE PELL, a daughter, as Savage supposes, of Joseph Pell, (free-man March 14, 1639,) of Lynn, Mass., the same town from which came Ann Lightfoot, the wife of the elder Daniel Thurston, who died without issue, a circumstance adding probability to Savage's conjecture. He was a trooper in Capt. Appleton's company in King Philip's war in 1675, and was paid £4 10s. June 24, 1676. He died Feb. 19, 1693.

(Extracts from the will of Daniel Thurston; for the rest see T. Gen. 1st Ed.)

BE IT KNOWN to all men by these presents, that I, Daniel Thurston, Senr., of Newbery in the county of Essex in New England, being weak in body but of perfect memory, doe hereby make my last will and testament.

Commending my soul to God and my body when it shall depart this life to decent buriall in an assured hope of a blessed resurrection. And for my worldly goods which God of his mercy hath given me I dispose of as followeth, viz.:

I have by deed of gift under my hand and seale made over to my sonne Daniel Thurston one-half of my lands and meadow that I have in the town of Newbery known by the name of Rake Lott, which was done upon his marriage, with all priviledges and appurtenances yerto belonging, and I doe now make over to my sonne Daniel Thurstain All my buildings with the other half of all my lands and meadows with priviledges and appurtenances yerto belonging on conditions as follows:

Item. I give and bequeath to my sonne James a parcel of land lying in Newbery known as my Rake Lott with my pistols and honisters, which is held in full of his portion.
