She died Middletown, Conn., Jan. 6, 1778. Res. Middletown, Conn. Children:

Y., 1813; married Middletown, Conn., Aug. 11, 1763, Relief Crosby, perhaps daughter of Samuel Crosby, who died at Middletown, Conn., in 1756—David Crosby was appointed guardian in 1759 to Relief Crosby of Middletown.—Res. John Alvord received a grant of land from his father in Middletown, Conn., in 1762. In 1764, as a resident of New Framingham (now Lanesboro), Mass., he sold land in Middletown and again in 1768. He was a resident of Lanesboro as late as 1786 and is called a cordwainer. About this date he moved to New Haven, Vt., and
