The following is a copy of the call for the first town meeting at Wilmington, Vt., where Caleb Alvord was especially prominent in the early history:

"Public Notis is hereby given to the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmington to meet at the House of Elijah Alvord's on Munday the 19th of Jan. Instant att one of the clock in the afternoon to Proceed as Followeth Viz. 1st—to Choose a moderator to govern said Meeting. 2ndly to See if the Town will agree with Mr. Chapin to Preach with us and if they will then 3rdly to Choose a Committy to agree with him 4thly to Choose a Committy to Regulate Past Votes as now they are on loos Pages. 5thly to Act upon any other Business the Town Shall see Cause to act upon. When met. by Order of the Committy, etc.

"Wilmington, January 17th, 1778.
