SAUL ALVORD (*Saul, Saul, John, Thomas, Alexander*), born Bolton, Conn., May 27, 1781; died Bolton, Conn., Oct. 31, 1842; married Nov. 11, 1806, Phebe Buell, daughter of Major John Hutchinson and Phebe (Hubbell) Buell. She was born Hebron, Conn., June 14, 1787; died Bolton, Conn., Feb. 24, 1857. Res. Bolton, Conn. Children:

He was educated at Bacon Academy, after which he spent several years teaching in Va. and at the Hartford Grammar School. Subsequently he engaged in mercantile business in Bolton, New Hartford, and Wolcottville, Conn. Eminently social and winning in his disposition, he was the life of every circle in which he moved. Like his ancestors, he was of an ardent, excitable temperament, ever ready and able to defend his rights and *the right*, yet kind and conciliatory to all. He died of consumption.

- 942. John Buell, b. Bolton, Conn., Dec. 6, 1821; d. Sept. 7, 1851; unmm. In early life he united with the Center Church of Hartford, Conn. He followed the occupation of a book-binder in Hartford and New York until the death of his brother in 1846, when he took a place in his brother's store. In his business he was attentive, peaceable, quiet and unassuming. In his deportment he was as gentle as a child. He died of consumption.

Saul Alvord graduated at Yale College in the class of 1800. In 1803 he was admitted to the bar of Tolland Co., Conn., and engaged in the practice of his profession in his native town. In Oct., 1811, with his wife he united with the Cong. Church in Bolton, Conn., which relationship continued until their death.

He held many important offices in Bolton, and was for several years associate judge of the county court. He was twice a member of the Legislature, and a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1818. He often represented his church in ecclesiastical bodies; was a trustee of the Nathan Hale donation.
