\* Russell Buckland and Fanny Waters mar. Sept. 6, 1812 (So. Ch. Rec. Hartford). Children of Coridon A. Alvord do not know name of grandfather Buckland, but say their grandmother's name was *Betsy Waters*. The parents given are probably correct.

Coridon Alexis Alvord was deeply interested in the publication of a genealogy of the Alvord family. For his part in the work, see *preface*. No better sketch of his life could be secured by the author than the following which is from Appleton's Cyclopaedia of American Biography:
