

LXII. LYSTON GILLETTE ALVORD (*Edwin Gillette, Ensign Datis, Elisha,-----*), born Mendon, Mich., Dec. 24, 1871; married Aug. 29, 1894, Mattie Carey Barrett, daughter of Alpheus and Jane Barrett. She was born Le Mars, Ia., Aug. 24, 1875. Res. Emporia, Kan., 1905. Children:

UNCLASSIFIED BRANCHES AND PERSONS BEARING THE NAME ALVORD.

(The following with some exceptions, probably have no connection with Alexander Alvord and his descendants.)

DOW ALVORD is said to have been born near Delphi, Ind., prob. about 1815; died near Viola, Wis., about 1896, aged 80 yrs. By his first wife he had one son, James Valentine, who married—Hurd, by whom he had a son Herbert Alvord, living in Mont., in 1908, and a daughter, Etta Alvord, living in St. Paul, Minn., 1908, unm. James Valentine Alvord deserted his family. Dow Alvord, by a second wife, had three daughters, Mary E., Malinda and Maggie. John L. Compton, a son of one of the daughters lives at West Alis, Wis., 1908.

WILLIAM ALVORD, a brother of Dow Alvord, moved from near Delphi, Ind., to the vicinity of Viola, Wis. He had sons: John and William, Jr. John Alvord lives near Viola, Wis., and has two sons and two daughters, William Alvord, Jr., married and moved to Michigan. (The above may reasonably be thought to be descendants of Alexander Alvord).

A man who bore the name of Alvord lived in a small stone house on the Crane farm in Carmel, N. Y. He was thought to be a Dutch immigrant, as he spoke very broken English, and was therefore probably not a descendant of the New England Alvords. He had a son, Augustus Alvord, who married Delicy S. Marvin, Apr.
