
GEN. ERIC

kan campaign.




DUKE ALBRECHT

of Bavaria, who took a leading part in the
Russian operations resulting in the Brest-
Litovsk Treaty.




GEN. VON DER GOLTZ,
leader of the Turkish forces in

when the victory of Kut-el-
Amara was won.



COUNT HELMUTH J. L. VON
MOLTKE,
Chief of Staff of the German
Army when the war began.



GEN. VON BUELOW,
who led one of the German armies in the
great offensive on the western front.



COUNT ZEPPELIN,
who originated the dirigible that bore his
name. The Count in his youth was aide-
de-camp to Gen. Ulysses S. Grant.



GEN. ALEXANDER VON STEIN,
Prussian Minister of War, intrusted with
the preparation of news of military oper-
ations for publication.
